### LIVE-IN INFORMATION

Our weekly live ins will begin next week, and students should bring the following:

1. Sleeping gear – sheet, blankets, pillow and pillowcases
2. 2 Changes of clothes including warm clothes
3. Poi for girls and shorts for boys (essential)
4. Named water bottle (essential)
5. Toiletries - Girls to be prepared!
6. \$5.00 for dinner (to be brought each Wednesday)
7. Any medication that students have must be recorded on the Health & Safety form attached so teachers have a register of medication.
8. Students must not bring Panadol to live-ins. If students are feeling unwell, they may ask for Panadol or will be sent home.

### FULL DAY PRACTICE INFORMATION

All Haka students will not attend any curriculum classes on a Thursday as this is an assigned project day. Students are not permitted to wear uniform on Thursdays therefore it is important that students bring adequate change to live-ins for practice days. Students will get lunch as usual.

### FINAL LIVE-IN INFORMATION

This will be a long live-in to do last preparations for our performance. More information will be sent out to you closer to the date.

### PERFORMANCE DAY INFORMATION

The national competition this year will be filmed in 5 different regions, held for closed judging and then broadcast on the 19<sup>th</sup> of September. This was set in place to ensure the health and safety of all involved and to ensure that the competition would not be cancelled due to traffic light changes in any region of the country.

Tāmaki Makaurau is one of 5 performing day regions where we will see the best of 3 regions perform at our host venue – Takaparawhau, Orākei. There are 10 performing groups in total – 6 from Tāmaki, 3 from Te Taitokerau and 1 from Nelson. More information regarding this day will be sent out closer to the date.

### TICKETING INFORMATION

At each of the 5 filming locations there will be a marquee that can seat a maximum of 1000 people; therefore, ticketing is allocated. There are no ticket sales online, our ticket allocation for our group will be distributed across the whānau in our group. These numbers are yet to be confirmed and I will update you on the status of ticket allocations closer to the date. Please do not rush out to find tickets as they are not available anywhere else but through your Kura.

### STUDENT CELL PHONE INFORMATION

During live-ins students will sign their phones in to teachers at 4:15pm and they will stay in the safe until Thursday 7am. Tutors will return phones to students at 7am on Thursday and they

will be required to sign them in to the office before 8:30am as per usual. If you need to contact your children during live-ins please call the Kura or email Mā Emery and we will get the message to your child.

### PERFORMANCE PREPARATION

It is important for students to prepare 2 important things before going on to stage.

1. Boys hair – It is important that boys retain a small patch of hair at the back middle of the head for feather placement. So, we ask that they please grow this part out and cut/style around it if they choose to have their haircut.
2. It is beneficial for all boys and girls to have both ears pierced at least 2 weeks before the performance as part of our uniform is wearing traditional ear pieces.
