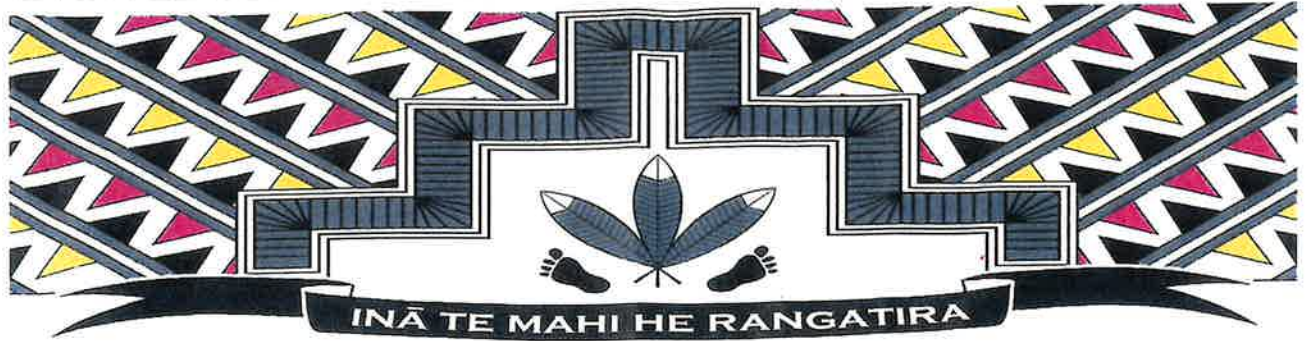

# TE KURA MĀORI O NGĀ TAPUWAE

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# Te Kura Māori o Ngā Tapuwāe



Welcome to Te Kura Māori o Ngā Tapuwāe. We are a special character Kura-a-iwi situated in Mangere, Auckland.

The majority of our teachers have been taught here at Ngā Tapuwāe and this is an advantage in promoting our school philosophy of "Inā Te Mahi He Rangatira", meaning "By deeds a chief is known". This means: enabling every student to reach his or her potential by educating them via their own language and cultural values – Te Reo Māori me ona Tikanga with the support of the local tribe – Waikato.

We have a strong ex-pupil commitment to our school and this compliments a very active parent network, which supports our school via fundraising and extra educational and curricular activities.

The Incorporated Society which the parents have formed is called Te Huarahi Hou and one of their main functions is to provide all students in the Kura with computers in their homes at minimal costs to parents and caregivers.

The school has further support from a culture group called Ngā Tapuwāe o Mataoho which is made up of ex-pupils, parents and supporters of Te Kura Māori o Ngā Tapuwāe. Furthermore, the Kura is supported by the Marae Committee, which holds monthly meetings from 7.00pm – 8.00pm.

Our students are all of Māori Heritage and seek entry into our school because of its special characteristics pertaining to Te Reo me ona Tikanga. At Te Kura Māori o Ngā Tapuwāe, we are developing curriculum pathways with Tertiary institutions in Te Reo Rangatira, Sports, Science and Health, Recreation, The Arts, Business Studies and the Technologies, while emphasizing a quality core programme and Academic excellence. Extra-curricular activities in Sport, The Arts and Culture are also well supported.

We have classes ranging from New Entrants Year 0 to the senior level Year 13.

Having classes available in all age groups allows Te Kura Māori o Ngā Tapuwāe to foster the philosophy of whānau. Here at Te Kura Māori o Ngā Tapuwāe we take the concept of family very seriously and this is embedded in our daily routines, which ensures our students a safe place for learning.

We are a total immersion Kura where all learning is provided through the medium of Te Reo Māori. As part of our special character, a focus is Te Reo me ona Tikanga, as such it is compulsory for all students from Year 1 through to Year 13 to take Te Reo Māori/Te Reo Rangatira and Kapa Haka.



# Te Kura Māori o Ngā Tapuwae



Nau mai ki Te Kura Māori o Ngā Tapuwae. He momo Kura-ā-lwi mātou kei Mangere, Tāmaki Makaurau. He taura tawhito te nuinga o ō mātou kaiako i Ngā Tapuwae, ā, he painga hoki tēnei hei hāpai i te whakatauki o te kura, arā, “Inā te Mahi he Rangatira”. Ko te whakamāramatanga o tēnei whakatauki, ma āu mahi ka Rangatira ai koe.

Ko te tikanga o tēnei; hei whakapakari i ngā taura katoa kia eke ai rātou ki ngā taumata tiketike. Mā te whakaako i roto i tō rātou reo me ngā tikanga tuku iho, arā, Te Reo Māori me ōna Tikanga me te tautoko o te haukāinga o tēnei rohe, a Waikato.

He pakari te whakarato o ngā taura tawhito o tēnei kura, ā, he āhuetanga hoki tēnei hei hāpai i ngā mahi huhua o te hunga mātua, me a rātou mahi kohikohi pūtea, a rātou mahi āpiti marau mātauranga.

Ko Te Huarahi Hou te īngoa o te kaporeihana kua whakatūria e te whānau. Ko tētahi o nga mahi matua o tēnei kaporeihana, hei whakarite, kia whiwhi rorohiko ngā taura katoa ki roto i o rātou kāinga, kia iti noa iho te utu mō ngā mātua me ngā kaitiaki. Kua hāpai anōtia te kura e tētahi kapa haka, arā, a Ngā Tapuwae o Mataoho me ōna kaihaka, arā, ngā taura tawhito o te kura, ngā mātua me nga Kaitautoko o Te Kura Māori o Ngā Tapuwae

Tāpiri atu ki tēnei, He Komiti Mātua hoki tō te kura nei, hei tautoko anō i ngā mahi a te kura. Ka hui tēnei komiti ia marama, ia marama, whitu karaka ki te waru karaka i te pō.

He Māori te katoa o a mātou taura. Nā nga āhuetanga motuhake o Te Reo Māori me ōna tikanga ka hiahia anō rātou ki te uru mai ki roto i te kura. He mahi tā Te Kura Māori o Ngā Tapuwae, hei whakawhanake i ngā hurarahi marau mātauranga huhua me ngā whare wānaga, arā, Te Reo Rangitira, Ngā Pūtaiao, Hākinakina me te Hauora, Ngā Mahi Toi, Ngā Mahi Pakihi, me te Mahi Hāngarau, kia whakaniko hoki ngā marautanga matua me te hīranga o ngā mahi mātauranga. Kua āta tautokongia hoki ngā mahi āpiti marau mātauranga pērā i ngā hākinakina katoa, Ngā Mahi Toi me Ngā Mahi Ahurea.

I tīmata ngā tūmomo akoranga mai i ngā Taura Urunga Hou (Tau 0) tae noa ki ngā taura tau Tekau ma Toru (Tau 13).

Ko te painga o nga taura i roto i ngā reanga katoa, ka taea tonutia e Te Kura Māori o Ngā Tapuwae te whāngai i te rapunga whakaaro o tēnei mea te “whānau”. He tino whai tikanga te “whānau” i roto i Te Kura Māori o Ngā Tapuwae, ā, e mau tonu ana tēnei whakaaro i roto i ngā mahi katoa. Ko te hua, he wāhi pai hei ako mō ngā tamariki.

He kura rūmaki reo tēnei, otirā ko ngā akoranga katoa kei roto i te reo Māori. Nā runga i te momo rongomaiwhiti o tō mātou kura i pēnei ai te aro ki Te Reo me ōna Tikana, nā whai anō ngā taura Tau 1 ki te 13 i whakahaua kia noho ki ngā akoranga Reo Māori/Reo Rangatira me te Kapa Haka anō hoki.

## ENROLMENT PROCEDURE

**The enrolment procedure for Te Kura Māori o Ngā Tapuwae is as follows:**

1. A parent enquires about the availability of a position for their child.
2. An enrolment pack is given or mailed out to them.
3. Once we receive a completed enrolment form, our current roll and waiting list will be assessed and they will be contacted by phone within a week. This call will inform them of whether there is a place available or if they have been added to the waiting list.
4. If there is a place available, contact is made with the parent/guardian/caregiver. This details the interview time and date and also requests that their birth certificate, immunisation certificate and last report be produced at the interview. It also requests the child be present as they will need to complete a listening and writing component at the level they will be entering.
5. The prospective parent and student will be interviewed by either the Principal, Deputy Principal or their designated representative.

**NB:** It is imperative that the prospective student has attended a Kohanga Reo or similar or has had the necessary language support of a minimum of 3 years. If the student meets these criteria then the following order of priority applies:

### Criteria for Priority of Enrolment:

- i. Mana whēnua; Te Waiohūa, Te Ahiwaru, Te Aki Tai, Ngāti Mahanga, Ngāti Tāhinga.
- ii. Children residing in Mangere with family currently attending Te Kura Māori o Ngā Tapuwae.
- iii. Children residing in Mangere in our catchment area
- iv. Children outside of our catchment area with immediate family in the Kura eg. brother/sister.
- v. Children with extended whanau connections in the Kura  
(E.g. existing families on the school roll / or who have been enrolled)
- vi. Recommendation letter from Kaumātua for existing families of the Kura.

In the event that there are no places available in the Year level of their need, their name will be placed on the waiting list which will be updated each term. Their enrolment will be prioritized according to the order previously stated. When a place becomes available the parents will be notified in writing and/or by phone. If there are any changes in their circumstances whilst on the waiting list you will need to make contact with the office to update your information.

6. Parents are notified of acceptance of their child although they must have completed the enrolment form, ICT contract and a dental enrolment form.
7. The child may not start school until he/she is fully outfitted in the correct uniform, unless dispensation has been given by the principal.
8. All students will adhere to the commitments deemed as appropriate by the official enrolment form

### Uniform

Students are required to have correct uniform when they enter the school. Except for the footwear the uniform can be purchased from the school office between the hours of 8.30am – 4.00pm.

**Term 1 & 4** Summer Uniform to be worn

**Term 2 & 3** Winter Uniform to be worn

### Kura Tuatahi Year 0 – 8

Summer: Black shorts, school coloured polo shirt, any hat, black sandals

Winter: Black track pants, school coloured polo shirt, school grey jersey, track shoes and socks

**Please note: This uniform is for both girls and boys. Please make sure school hats are worn during the summer months. All students should have a drink bottle for water**

### Girls Uniform – Y9 – Y13

Summer: Grey Skirt, Grey School Polo Shirt, Black Sandals

Winter: Grey Trousers, Grey Polo Shirt, School Cardigan, White Socks and Black Lace-up Shoes  
(Optional) Grey Skirt and Brown Stockings/White Socks

### Boys Uniform – Y9 – Y13

Summer: Grey Shorts, White/Light Grey School Polo Shirt, Black Sandals

### 'Kura Number ones' - Year 9 – 13

The 'Kura Number Ones' are compulsory for all special occasions and trips outside of school. If a student is not in full number one uniform they will not be permitted to leave school. These items need to be purchased before the first week of May each year.

This uniform includes a white hard collared shirt that fits well around the student's neck, a skirt for girls or trousers for boys and a Black Ngā Tapuwāe Dress Jersey, Kura Tie and Kura Blazer. Natural coloured stockings are to be worn by all girls with their skirts.

### Footwear

Black sandals for girls and boys during summer (Term 1 and Term 4)

Black leather lace-up shoes and grey knee-high socks (If wearing shorts) for boys (Term 2 and 3)

Black leather lace-up shoes and white ankle socks for girls (Term 2 and 3)

The girls may also wear brown stockings

Please note that the Utungahau Fees are due to be paid by the last day of Term 2. For any new enrolments who start school after the due date please pay 2 weeks prior to the activity week.

We welcome gradual payments either in cash at the office or by automatic payment/direct credit. Bank account details and automatic payment forms can be requested from the office.



## **PARENT INFORMATION**

### **Te Reo me ōna Tikanga**

One of our key focuses is Te Reo me ōna Tikanga. As such, it is compulsory for all students from Year 1 – 13 to learn through the medium of the Māori language and take Te Reo Māori/Te Reo Rangatira as a subject in Kura Tuarua. All students from new entrants right through to Year 13 must also participate in Kapa Haka.

### **Lateness**

All students are expected at school no later than 8.30am daily. If a child is late, they must come directly to the office with a note advising the reason for their lateness and an immediate contact number. If they do not have a note, they will automatically be placed on lunchtime detention.

### **Absenteeism**

Parents are expected to contact the school if they know that their child is not going to be attending school on any given day. When your child returns to school, they are to bring a note signed by a parent/caregiver/guardian explaining the reasons they were absent. It is imperative we have a written explanation as to your child's absence for auditing purposes. We expect that all students attend at least 90% of the school year.

### **Drugs, Alcohol, Graffiti, Gum, Swearing & Litter**

There is a "Zero Tolerance" for any of the above. Students caught doing graffiti, chewing gum, littering, or swearing will be dealt with harshly by their deans. Any students caught doing drugs or alcohol will face serious disciplinary consequences.

### **Attendance at all school activities**

It is compulsory for your child to attend all school activities, be they live-ins, school excursions, sport activities (they have enrolled in), mentoring, learning support, Credit intensives. Part of your enrolment in this school means that you agree to support the school by making sure that your child participates in all compulsory activities.

### **Some costs you may need to know about**

- Field Trips \$10 per trip (as an estimate)
- Theatre visits for Y7 – 10
- Regional Manu Korero Trips \$10 (June)
- National Manu Korero trip cost \$120 (as an estimate August – September)
- Senior Prize-giving \$75 (student cost included in Utungahau)
- National Kapa Haka \$300 - \$500 (as an estimate)

### **Whanau Expectations**

There are approximately 8 Whanau Hui held every year. All parents are expected to attend the Hui, these are held in the Wharenui and start at 7.00pm sharp. A "calendar of events" is sent out via our newsletters at the beginning of every term confirming the dates of the Whanau Hui and other important events. This is usually followed up with a reminder notice on the day of the Hui. Parents are also expected to be supportive of all major events happening at the school such as the Gala Day, Te Ahurea, Manu Korero and fundraising ventures. Our students participate in all the above.

### **Cell phones**

***No cell phones are permitted at school.*** If a student requires a cell phone for after school purposes, they need to hand them into the office. Students will receive detention if they are caught with them during school hours and it will result in the confiscation of the phone until a parent comes in to retrieve it. We take no responsibility for any cell phones that are lost or stolen at school.

### **ASB Banking**

If you would like your child to bank with ASB come into the office to pick up an enrolment form. Fill it out and then send it back to the office. We will then validate the form with the Ngā Tapuwae Stamp, sign it and then send it on to our School Account Manager. Once they have processed this information your child can start

banking. The students can pick up their banking envelopes from the office and once they are filled out, can put them in our School Banking Deposit Bin. We do our banking once a week (usually on a Friday) so remember to deposit your money first thing in the morning.

### **Kai**

Breakfast, morning tea and lunches are provided by the kura for all students free of charge.

Breakfast is served between 8:00am – 8:25am in Nga Hau Mangere (Wharekai). Morning tea (fruit and snacks) can be found in our wharekai and in our tuatahi classrooms. Lunches are cooked onsite daily by our kitchen staff and are delivered to the kura tuatahi classes by senior students and served during Wā kai nui (Lunch) in the wharekai to kura tuarua students.

### **Students Cars**

If a student wishes to drive a car to school then s/he must follow these procedures:

1. Must have permission from the Principal
2. Provide written lawful permission from their parents
3. Must hold a restricted or full license
4. Must hand keys in to the Kura office upon arrival to school
5. May not leave during school hours
6. May not transport other students

### **Head Lice Checks**

Head lice are an ongoing problem at any school. The Turuki Health staff or Te Kura Māori o Ngā Tapuwae staff will conduct hair checks at regular intervals. If a student has been identified as having nits and/or Head lice, their parent/caregiver will be contacted and they will be sent home with a note from their teacher. We will not accept any child returning to school until their hair is completely clean of nits and head lice (dead or alive) and they are re-checked in the presence of a parent.

Our procedure is to keep Head lice to a minimum and the School Community asked that the following processes be in place:

- ☞ Regular checks be held
- ☞ Any students that are identified to have lice are treated with respect and dignity
- ☞ They are informed in confidence and the parents are contacted
- ☞ Students will be sent home
- ☞ In the event parents are unreachable, students will remain in class only for that day and a letter will accompany them home
- ☞ Parents will also be offered the health nurses contact number in order to get extra support
- ☞ Children can only be returned to school when their hair is completely clean. Followed by a check from staff while parent is present.

**Please note:** The procedure is conducted in confidence in order to maintain the dignity of children. Furthermore the school outlines to the child that it is not their fault and this is out of everyone's control. Children are further reminded that having Head lice does not mean that they are unclean.

## HOMWORK

All students need to do homework. Every week, homework should be given and checked so children are used to the idea.

- ☞ Y1 – 3: 10 minutes per night – an hour over the week.
- ☞ Y4 – 6: two hours over the week.
- ☞ Y7 - 10 students should be doing about four to five hours over the week:
- ☞ Y11 -13 should be doing 2 hours per day.

Teachers have been asked to timetable when they will be giving homework for each year level so that it assists students to manage their time throughout the week.

Eg for an hour slot: 20 minutes reading  
15 minutes written work  
10 minutes spelling/dictionary study  
15 minutes maths tables/division

### Standards in Books

Please make yourself informed about Ngā Tapuwae book expectations. Reinforce correct setting out on a daily basis. Encourage your child to care for their books. Praise your child when they take care with their setting out and maintain a high standard of work. Do not accept untidy work. Make sure that no pages are left free; all students should be guided through this procedure for the first month of school to make sure the expectation is reached. Parents please be supportive.

A suggestion is for all students to write in pencil in their maths books.

### Book Expectations

All students are expected to:

- ☞ Use a pencil or blue or black pen when writing
- ☞ Always have the appropriate textbooks
- ☞ Use a red pen for ruling lines
- ☞ Always use a ruler
- ☞ Write the full date at the beginning of each lesson
- ☞ Underline the date with one line in red pen
- ☞ Rule off from margin to end of the page
- ☞ Rule off at the end of each lesson
- ☞ There should be no other lines ruled around page
- ☞ Write neatly at all times in the same coloured pen
- ☞ Utilise all page space
- ☞ Use the correct book for the work set
- ☞ Ensure that all set work is completed
- ☞ Not tear out pages
- ☞ Keep inside and outside of books tidy and graffiti free
- ☞ Ensure that their books do not have 'dog ears' (folded/creased corners)

## Students Code of Conduct

1. Students are to always advocate themselves and Te Kura Māori o Ngā Tapuwāe with pride.
2. Students will always uphold and encourage all Te Kura Māori o Ngā Tapuwāe rules.
3. Students will arrive at school no later than 8:30am daily.
4. Students will be well groomed and well presented in school uniform for each day.
  - a) Students are to ensure that the only jewellery worn is one set of earrings (studs or sleepers) and a taonga. There are no rings, necklaces, bangles, or other forms of jewellery to be worn.
  - b) Students' hair is expected to be maintained and of a natural colour and if longer than shoulder length, tied back with a black or white hair tie/s.
  - c) Boys facial hair is to be always cleanly shaven.
  - d) Love bites or markings are not acceptable, you will be sent home until they are gone
  - e) Inappropriate body markings/piercings are not to be visible.
5. Students will be punctual to each lesson of the day.
6. Students will exercise high standards of discipline and respect.
7. Students will take Te Reo Māori/Rangatira and Kapa Haka at all year levels.
8. Students will ensure that all equipment owned by school will be always treated in a correct manner. Students will be held responsible for any goods they damage.
9. All students are responsible for keeping their passwords confidential.
10. Students will treat all other students fairly and respectfully.
11. Students will respect all staff.
12. All book records should be available for each teacher. It should be legible and reader friendly.
13. Students will regularly celebrate the achievements of peers.
14. Students' personal belongings should be always kept at home or safe.
15. All students are to acknowledge the student "hierarchy" i.e., Prefects/Y13/Y12 etc / girls before boys etc.
16. Students are to be active participants in all whare duties and activities.
17. Students will produce a legible note of reason when out of school uniform, late or absent.

# Common Questions Asked? ... The WHAT IF'S ...

Q: **What do I do if my child is late?**

A: Bring or send them into the office and the student signs in on the tablet **accompanied with a note/or parent to explain lateness**. Student continues onto class with a note for the teacher to file.

Q: **What do I do if my child is away for more than 2 days?**

A: If your child is away due to sickness they must come to school with a note or **doctor's certificate**. If s/he is away for any other circumstances, please ring the office immediately remembering to mention your child's name, classroom and which teacher the message is for. When they return to school, please ensure your child has a note from you confirming the dates they were away from school and the reason. All notes must be signed and dated correctly with an accompanying telephone number if teacher needs to contact you.

Q: **What stationery does my child need?**

A: Each student should have received a stationery list by the last day of school in the previous year, or on confirmation of enrolment if your child is new. Please obtain a copy of your child's stationery list from the office if required. Please ensure your child has all stationery requirements by Friday Week 2 of Term 1.

Q: **Where can we purchase stationery from?**

A: The Kura does not sell stationery so you will need to purchase your stationery from any school stationery supplier such as Warehouse Stationery or purchase a pack online via [www.myschool.co.nz](http://www.myschool.co.nz)

Q: **Where can we get the uniforms from?**

A: The Kura uniforms can be purchased from the school office **Mon – Fri 8:30am to 4pm** Please be aware that the Kura Tuatahi pants and shorts can be purchased from the Warehouse, Postie Plus, Kmart or any other stockists such as these.

Q: **What are the Whānau Hui times?**

A: The Whānau Hui **always** starts at 7pm **sharp!**

Q: **How do I contact my teacher?**

A: There are a few ways in which you can contact your teacher. For safety reasons we can not supply home phone numbers or cell phone numbers of any staff under any circumstances. If it is for classroom enquiries, it may be easier to send a note in with your child and request a reply. If you would like to meet with them personally, you will need to ring the office and leave a message for the teacher in question to return your call, asking to book an appointment time with them. Appointments can not be made during 'class time'; your teacher will advise you of what time suits them best.
