There are a few things happening over the next couple of weeks that we want to update you about:

Report Evening

Report Evening is taking place this Wednesday 3rd April from 3.30pm until 7pm and we ask you to bring your child/ren along to share in the conversations. Upon arrival, we ask that you come straight to the office where you can collect your reports.

- ☞ If you have multiple children across different parts of the school we encourage you to arrive early or bring another person with you.
- ☞ If your child has not been here for six weeks they will not have an official report. However, you are invited to speak to their teacher if you wish to get a verbal update on their progress.
- ☞ You may also choose to contact your child/childrens teacher to organise alternative ways of meeting to discuss school reports however, teachers will submit their availability in terms of time slots.
